

























Well done everyone! I am so proud of the children, and I am sure you are too.

This week was Road Safety Week.




- 1 Find a safe place to cross.





Road Safety Hedgehogs - Stop Look Listen Live







PE AND SPORTS NEWS

Another busy few weeks for sports and has seen our Football, Dodgeball and our brand new Goalball teams in action. First up were the Goalball team. Goalball is a Paralympic sport where all players wearing blindfolds try to roll a ball (with bells inside) into the oppositions goal. Being visually impaired means the children must tune into their other senses to compete. Our children did this brilliantly and for their first time entering, represented our school fantastically. Finishing in the top half of the final table.



Next up were two of our Y3-4 Football teams. They visited Our Lady of Lourdes after school for a match in very cold conditions. One of our teams won 7-1 whilst the other lost 4-1. Our children, as always, played with respect for each other, the opposition and the referee's.



Finally, our Y3-4 dodgeball team were in action in a borough wide competition. There were 22 schools in total competing to win the championship shield. Our team got off to a great start winning their first two games and this momentum continued throughout the day with them making their way to the final! The final itself against Bournemouth Park was a very close game with both teams taking a game each and taking it to a final decider. With balls flying everywhere and our children dodging, dipping, and diving their way throughout the game the decisive moment came when Cooper hit one of their players in the dying seconds to win our team the championship shield. It will now take pride of place with our many other dodgeball trophies!

EYFS






