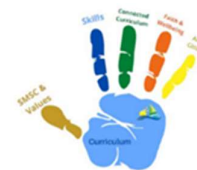


Year 5 Curriculum Letter – Autumn 2 2025

What will my child be learning this half term:

Core learning	<p>In writing we will be linking our cycles to our history topic.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A diary of a WW1 soldier in the trenches.• A non-fiction report on the original use of castles and then during WW1.• A story from two different perspectives of a family coping with a member going to fight in WW1. <p>This half term we have a writing for enjoyment sessions linked to our history topic using the John Lewis WW1 themed Christmas advert as a hook.</p>
	<p>In reading the books we will be studying will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Horrible Histories: Frightful WW1• Goodnight Mr Tom by Michelle Magorian• Wonder by R.J Palacio• The Witches by Roald Dahl and Horrible Histories: Gorgeous Georgians
	<p>In maths we will be covering the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Line graphs and timetables• Multiplication and division• Area and perimeter
Skills	<p>In skills lessons we will be engaging in lessons linked to the following areas:</p> <p>Music: delivered by the Southend Music Hub with a focus on learning to play the glockenspiel.</p> <p>French: Do you have a pet?</p>
Connected curriculum	<p>Our focus unit this half term is called 'Castles and WW1'. This is a history-based unit with connections across the curriculum. The topic covers the Norman</p>

	<p>invasion and the building and uses of the first castles. We will also look at how WW1 started and how these castles were repurposed during this time.</p> <p>History skills that will be taught will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use sources of information to form historically valid questions about the past. • Summarise life in Britain from medieval times and beyond • Compare some of the times studied with those of other areas of interest around the world. • Understand the concept of continuity and change over time. • Use dates and terms accurately in describing events.
Faith, Health and Wellbeing	<p>During Faith and well-being lessons we will be thinking about the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What would Jesus do? • Anti-bullying week • Why is self-respect important? • Why is sleep important? • Should we stereotype people? <p>Our Learning and Life skills focus this half term is called: It's up to me! Our targets are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I can take responsibility for keeping to the class and school rules/codes even when no adults are present. • I can plan ahead for things that I need to do within set timescales.
<p>Homework</p> <p>Your child will bring home a copy of our knowledge organiser for each half term. A copy of the overview will be sent to your MCAS account. Spellings will be taught through our Emile scheme with a weekly spelling rule taught in class. The spelling rule and words will be given to your child on the half termly homework overviews with a short assessment completed the following week. Please practice these words and other words containing the rule at home.</p>	
<div>  <p>Accelerated Reader</p> </div> <p>As a Reading First school, we promote daily reading. Your child will bring home a book or a phonics book. They will be given an Accelerated Reader book at their reading level which they will need to read for at least 20 minutes a day and then complete an AR quiz. We promote reading for enjoyment as well so please encourage all kinds of reading and books at home that your child enjoys. <div>  </div> <p>In Year 5, we continue to promote TTRS. The app can be downloaded to all smartphones and tablets and it is also available online at https://ttrockstars.com/ This will support our children in their recall of multiplication facts. Your child will have a log in for TTRockstars and we encourage daily practice for at least 6 minutes a day.</p>
